As a charity we are obliged to help the English community through grant giving activities in the areas of education and community development.

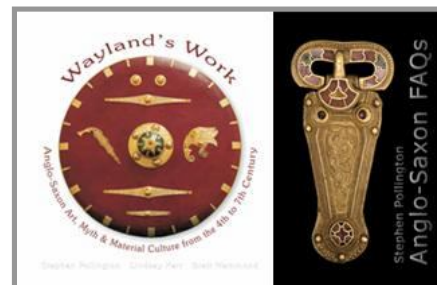
